Aims of the Training Session

The current Training Session is organized under the umbrella of the TRUSTEE project - <u>http://www.trustee-project.eu</u> and aims at:

- Learning to analyse how changes in agricultural policies affect agrifood markets, farming decisions and the environment.
- Improving knowledge about agricultural economics and quantitative modelling of agriculture.
- Learning how to work with result sets from the CAPRI model and its Graphical User Interface (GUI).
- Discussing issues of common interest for CAPRI contributors and users (i.e. model development and maintenance).

Organisation of the Training Session

The Training Session will start on Monday 14th afternoon with a pre-session for CAPRI beginners, focusing on the basic structure of CAPRI, an introduction to the Graphical User Interface (GUI) and the CAPRI installation on laptops. From Tuesday 15th to Thursday 17th September, the sessions will concentrate on using existing result sets from scenario analysis based on CAPRI. Participants will work in small groups (3-6) supervised by a trainer.

Laptop needed

Participants should whenever possible bring along a Laptop with about 1.5 Gigabyte of free space and should have access to an administrator account if <u>TortoiseSVN</u> as well as an updated <u>Java Run Time Engine</u> (32bit or 64bit) are not yet installed.

Costs

There is no fee for the training itself. Participants have to cover travel, accommodation and meals.

Travelling by plain

Adolfo Suárez Madrid-Barajas receives all international flights arriving in Madrid. It is located 12 kilometres northeast of the capital.

Travelling by train

Madrid is the centre of the extensive <u>Renfe</u> railway network, Mid-Distance, Long Distance, High Speed and Suburban trains depart from and arrive at the two main stations: Atocha and Chamartín. International trains to and from France and Portugal also depart from and arrive in Madrid.

Accommodation

Please note that we have not blocked hotel rooms for the attendants. How to get to the hotel

From Madrid airport to Argüelles:

- **Metro** Line 8 from Airport T4 or T1 to Nuevos Ministerios and then Line 6 from Nuevos Ministerios to Argüelles.
- **Taxi**: You must go to the official taxi ranks to pick up a taxi. There is a flat rate of 30 € for services between the airport and the city centre (within the M 30 ring road).
- Cercanías (local train): The suburban train network runs between Príncipe Pío station and Adolfo Suárez Madrid-Barajas Airport Terminal 4, on the new C-1 line. Trains depart every half hour and you can check ticket prices <u>here</u>. Then, metro line 6 from Principe Pio to Argüelles.

From Atocha train station to Argüelles:

- Metro Line 1 from Atocha to Bilbao and then Line 4 from Bilbao to Argüelles
- Taxi
